It separated the free and the slave states. It extended along the Ohio River and Southern Border of Pennyslvania.

Secession

In the year, **1860/1861** President **Abraham Lincoln** was elected President of the United States .

The Southern states feared the **Federal Government** would abolish slavery.

South Carolina was the first state to secede in the year **1860.**

These six states formed the **Confederate States of America/Confederacy**.

The First Major Battle

Union leader McDowell's troops attacked the Confederate general Beauregard's troops. The confederates retreated. Later that day, General Thomas Jackson brought **reinforcements**, and was able to hold back the Union.

The Long Fight

Lincoln made **George B. McClellan** the leader of the Union Army.

Robert E. Lee was made the leader of the confederate army.

In September 1862, Union General George McClellan and Confederate General **Robert E. Lee** clashed near Antietam Creek in Maryland. This was the bloodiest day in the Civil War. About **2,000** Northerners and **2,700** Southerners lost their lives.

Union Victory

How did Grant finally capture Petersburg, Virginia? He lead a siege.

In September 1864, General William T. Sherman and his troops marched through **Georgia** and **The Carolinas** tearing up railroads tracks and burning property. He captured Atlanta. This is know as "Sherman's March."

In April, 1865, General **Lee** surrendered to General **Grant** ending the Civil War.

Results of the War

A total of **620,000** soldiers were lost because of the Civil war.

What did the 13th Amendment to the Constitution do?

It ended slavery in all parts of the United States.

President Lincoln saved the Union, ended slavery, but then what happened to him? **He was assassinated**.
